

## October 2017 Sightings Report

It was a warm month with pleasant afternoons for outdoor activities. The mid-September to mid-October period was the warmest on record, then it cooled towards month's end, with showers and finally lake effect rain. It was the 6<sup>th</sup> warmest October on record, though the only daily record was a tie for record high low on the 8<sup>th</sup>.

Temperatures averaged 57.7 °F, 7.1° above normal. It was also the 4<sup>th</sup> wettest October on record, with the total 6.71" at 3.99" above normal. There were 2 days of record rainfall, with 2.39" on the 9<sup>th</sup> and 2.10" on the 29<sup>th</sup>. Both were from remnants of tropical storms.

This year, the species total for the month was back to right on the average for the past 10 years. Apparent arrivals and departures were about as expected relative to their old distributions and experience in the years since. There were a few species that often linger into October that were missed, e.g. Virginia Rail, Sora, the cuckoos, Philadelphia Vireo, and Rose-breasted Grosbeak, but the interquartile ranges of their departure distributions all overlap October 1, so not being seen in October is not really surprising. Still, there was a feel of lack of numbers for many migrants, backed by relatively low peak counts in most cases as illustrated by numbers in the Noteworthy Records table.

Again, waterfowl, loon, and grebe numbers in our region were generally low. The peak counts for many species are captured in the noteworthy table. All really expected species were reported. The number of days with Brant reported and the peak numbers recorded were both again up a bit.. But again there were no really big days for either loon species. Cackling Goose was typical of recent years. Harlequin Duck at several sites was interesting for this early. So far Northern Gannet remains missing for yet another fall. There were no special herons in our region, though some appeared nearby.

The fall raptor picture was again slow. Black Vulture was reported again over High Acres Nature Area as well as at Letchworth State Park. Northern Goshawk went unreported. There were no late Broad-winged Hawks, but there had been few reports through the summer locally. Rough-legged Hawks appeared late in the month in small numbers. Both Merlin and Peregrine Falcon numbers were good, and a late report noted that Merlin nested again in the northeast part of Rochester. American Kestrel seemed scarce this month.

Twenty shorebird species is again decent variety, but numbers were generally pathetically low. Lake Ontario levels have dropped some from the flooding highs of spring, but are still not low enough to produce much shorebird habitat. Again, there were no particularly rare species or unusual dates.

There were a good number of reports of passing Pomarine and Parasitic Jaegers plus a burst of Bonaparte's Gulls on the 16<sup>th</sup> and a number of adult Little Gulls with them, and then off and on for the rest of the month. Other than that, the gull and tern scene was lackluster.

Among the non-passerine land birds, we had the token 2 Eurasian Collared-Doves seen by Andy Guthrie on the 29<sup>th</sup> and 31<sup>st</sup>, a normal Short-eared Owl arrival, reports of Northern Saw-whet Owl banding, a few Chimney Swifts lingering, and 3 reports of Ruby-throated Hummingbird into this month. Red-headed Woodpecker was noted only from Hamlin Beach State Park, and 8 were found by Sheryl Gracewski while canoeing along Irondequoit Creek.

Again, most of the passerine species regularly expected were reported. Numbers were generally low. The banding total for this fall was the lowest for the past 7 years at Braddock Bay Bird Observatory (BBBO) (data I have easy access to). Totals for a number of species are included as illustrations in the noteworthy table. It was a down year for Black-capped Chickadee, only 5 banded this month, and Blackpoll Warbler was back to more typical low numbers. Most totals, while seeming low, are within one standard deviation of the average for the past six years. The only real rarities were two reports of White-eyed Vireo, one of these banded, and Cave Swallows passing Hamlin Beach State Park on the 23<sup>rd</sup> (others seen in nearby regions). There are no obvious irruptions of northern species at this point other than possibly Pine Siskin, for which there were some good counts later in the month. For other winter finches, we had only single reports of Red Crossbill early in the month and Common Redpoll later at BBBO.

There were about 19,250 eBird records for the month from 155 observers, essentially the same as last year, and another 16 notes posted to geneseebirds plus data from BBBO and other contributors.
