

April 2018 Sightings Report

It was a generally cold April with a bit above normal precipitation. The first 10 day period was the coldest on record for that period. Into the 4th week of the month, we were still 2nd coldest on record, but then there were a few warm days, and we ended the 10th coldest April on record, with temperatures averaging 40.8 °F, 5.5° below normal. Precipitation at 3.50" was 0.77" above normal, with 1.34" of that falling on the 16th. Most of the snow that fell was in the first half of the month, with 5.2" total, just 1.3" above normal. The April snowfall was enough to push the winter's total just over 10 ft. There was a wind storm on April 3th-4th that did some damage, but mostly to our west, and an icing event that caused much concern on April 14th-15th, but little damage locally. Water levels were above average on Lake Ontario, but a repeat of last year's flooding seems unlikely. At month's end, leaf-out and flowering was way behind. A persistent frontal boundary and line of heavy storms to our south and southwest delayed the arrival of many species of birds. The total species counts for the month and year were well behind the last few years, yet the birds that were found arrived mostly in the 1st quartile of their arrival date distributions. It is always interesting to compare data with feelings.

Once more, all the expected waterfowl were recorded. Also again, by late in the month the numbers of lingering birds were very low, continuing the trend. Peak numbers for most species were also low, as illustrated in the maxima in the Noteworthy Records table. A few isolated good counts were caught for diving ducks, loons, and grebes, often passing or resting birds on Lake Ontario. Highlights of the month included: an early Brant, 2 male Eurasian Wigeons, and a passing King Eider. Other water and marsh birds are usually scarce this month, so photos of an American Bittern walking through Martha Zettel and Bill O'Brien's backyard in Rush early in the month was interesting.

The hawk watch was slow with the weather blockage to the south and winds consistently from wrong directions. The warmup late in the month finally brought some Broad-winged Hawks on the 21st, then a burst for nearly all species on the 24th and a couple of decent days towards the end the month. Turkey Vultures still outnumbered Broad-winged Hawks at month's end. Eagle numbers, while down a bit, were still good. A single Black Vulture was the only rarer "raptor" of month. For all the negative feel, there were still 8 days with totals over 1000 birds, only 2 less than last year.

Shorebirds were again one of the weak families, with only 11 species reported and numbers very low. Water levels were high across the region, and puddles and pools in the fields first devoid of birds, then dried up. Carncross Road in the Northern Montezuma Wildlife Management Area (NMWMA) was the best site in our region. In spite of this, there was a wonderful highlight, with a near-breeding-plumaged Ruff found near Port Byron not far east of our region into Region 5 on April 10th, joined by a reeve on April 12th, and then both re-found at Carncross Road on the 14th by the Rowleys. The reeve was next located on Van Dyne Spoor on the 15th and the Ruff back to Port

Byron on the 16th, and the reeve (female Ruff) there on the 20th. To top it off, on May 6th the Ruff, now in full breeding plumage, showed up at Benning Marsh along the wildlife drive. There are many gorgeous photos online in eBird.

Gulls provided another set of highlights mainly related to a large die-off of gizzard shad and other fish species in Irondequoit Bay with the harsh late winter and heavy ice cover. For much of the month, there were on the order of 10,000+ gulls on the bay feeding on this bounty, with a large percentage of the gulls in the larger, Herring Gull + size species. This included many good counts of Herring, Iceland, Lesser Black-backed, and Glaucous Gulls. There was also a sighting and photos of a possible Yellow-legged/Lesser Black-backed Gull. There were good numbers of some of these species noted elsewhere, too. A Little Gull was seen offshore in the town of Wolcott. The regular terns of our region all were reported at relatively early arrival dates.

The last Snowy Owl report was on the 19th near Retsof, but a bird in the field adjacent to the hawk watch much of the day on April 2th was a special treat. The DEC owl surveys on the 10th and 24th continued to turn up Short-eared Owls late in the season. The owl counting at the "Owl Woods" area on Manitou Beach Road had a very weak month, with 16 Long-eared but only two Northern Saw-whet owls tallied. But a visit from a Boreal Owl on April 25th, the Region's 18th record, made up for that. Eastern Whip-poor-will arrived on the 28th, a typical date. A very good Northern Flicker movement was noted at several points on the lakeshore on the 24th.

The Braddock Bay Bird Observatory (BBBO) banding effort was off to a fairly slow start, with only 897 new bands and 654 of those were kinglets. The late season led to many Golden-crowned Kinglets banded, whereas usually most of their movement is done before the banding starts. It is hard to imagine working the nets with 164 Ruby-crowned Kinglets banded on April 27th. It was clearly a "down" year on the Black-capped Chickadee seesaw, with 0 banded vs. 441 banded last April. Many passerines arrived at nearly normal dates. However, there were only 11 species of warblers reported and only Common Yellowthroat really early and only Pine and Yellow-rumped Warblers in the first half of the month. Only 3 warbler species and only 5 total individuals were banded! The species that often pass in large numbers, such as Blue Jays, American Crows, and American Robins, were not tallied in any really sizable numbers. The few counts noted in the noteworthy table were most often the lone number of note for the month for a species. The only really rare passerine was a Western Meadowlark found singing on the Wayne County side of Armitage Road on April 14th and still present well into May. It is the first Western Meadowlark found in the region since 2008. To the joy of some county listers, the bird sometimes moved across the road to sing in Seneca County. Winter finches again included only a lone Common Redpoll and some Pine Siskins.

This month there were about 47,930 eBird records submitted and 5% or so additional records from other sources.
