

October 2018 Sightings Report

It was a split month, weather-wise; the first 10 days were warm, followed by the rest of the month being cold and damp. The warmth led to late foliage color and very late foliage drop, but also to more than usual numbers of later departure dates. Temperatures averaged 50.9 °F, just 0.3° above normal. There were 3 days in a row above 80° from the 8th-10th, and record highs set on the 9th and 10th, with 72° on the 9th an all-time high for October. Two to 3 inches of rain fell in the first 10 days over much of Western New York, followed by cold, gray skies and light rain or drizzle most days the rest of the month. Precipitation at 3.83" was 1.11" above normal, with 0.1" of snow on the 18th right at normal. The first freeze of the season was on October 30.

The species total for the month was the highest on record at 213, yet there were no really outstanding rare birds. Apparent arrivals and departures were about as expected relative to their old distributions, arrivals in the 1st quartile and interquartile range and departures interquartile range (13) and largely 4th quartile (42), with 9 more species past the late date in the old guide but with several dates each later than this year in the intervening years. Record late departures were recorded for Chimney Swift, Wilson's Phalarope, and Warbling Vireo. If some of the comments seem in strange order, both you and I are, starting with last month and now this, trying to adjust to the move by NYSOA and eBird to the new order of the AOS checklist. This will also appear in the Noteworthy Records tables to be posted (awaiting some late input) on the RBA website. The eBird records downloaded this month for the region totaled 30,786, a jump of 50% over last year and certainly bolstered by the observers visiting for the NYSOA annual meeting here on October 5-7.

All expected waterfowl were reported, though generally at relative low numbers. Only Eurasian Wigeon and Cackling Goose were relatively rarer. Good counts were noted for Cackling Goose and for American Wigeon, Northern Pintail, and Green-winged Teal, with the best counts for the latter 3 species in the Northern Montezuma Wildlife Management Area (NMWMA). Diving ducks were noted only in relatively low peak counts. Grebe maxima were unexceptional. Loons now appear after shorebirds and gulls and terns followed by egrets and the raptors; numbers were relatively low, and again and there were no rarities. Again, so far no Northern Gannet.

Some of the non-passerine land birds now end up here. Among the interesting observations are Chimney Swift record late on October 22 and 30, though there will be at least one later November record, and a hummingbird reported in the town of Conesus on October 20 but not ID'd to species.

Twenty-three shorebird species was a small increase over the past few years. Again, numbers were generally very low. Departure dates followed this fall's trend to later dates, with the record late Wilson's Phalarope among them. Hudsonian Godwit at 2 locations and a Red Phalarope were the most interesting finds.

There was a reasonable number of about 8 Parasitic Jaegers and 2 others not ID'd to species. Otherwise, 3 adult Little Gulls and 4 Lesser Black-backed Gulls topped the gull and tern list.

The fall raptor picture was again slow. A Black Vulture was reported from the town of Victor, and Osprey was a bit late on October 25 in both Greece and Irondequoit. There were 259 lines of Bald Eagle records in eBird that could be analyzed to arrive at some feel for the actual number of birds: many. Beyond that, numbers and arrival and departure dates were typical until we end with a relatively rare fall Golden Eagle seen in the town of Tyre, Wayne County. Northern Goshawk again was unreported. The last Broad-winged Hawk noted was on the 1st. Rough-legged Hawk first appeared on the 20th, with only one other report on the next day. All 3 regular falcons were well reported this fall.

The first Snowy Owl was reported from the Sodus Point area a bit early on the 28th. No Short-eared Owls were found by month's end, and only one Northern Saw-whet Owl was reported banded at Braddock Bay Bird Observatory (BBBO). Red-headed Woodpecker was again noted only from Hamlin Beach State Park and with few reports.

Again, nearly all the expected passerine species were reported. Numbers were again generally low. The full banding data was not available for analysis at the time of this writing. Among the more interesting observations were: Warbling Vireo record late on October 24; Evening Grosbeaks, Common Redpoll, and Pine Siskins seen later in the month; Nelson's Sparrows at Burger Park mid-month; 22 species of warbler reported, with Connecticut and 14 Orange-crowned the most interesting, but also many to relatively late departure dates. Cave Swallow was not reported, but the weather pattern gives hope of that species soon.
